VOTE SPLATS.....

Did you know that Crash gets fan mail? He's like Santa, but a gorilla, and he brings joy and Splats to all learners. Lately, he's been hearing these questions A LOT:

- What's a vote?
- Who gets to vote?
- Why do we vote?
- When do we vote?
- Where do we vote?
- I'm hungry!



The last one isn't a question, but he says you should go drink water—you're probably just thirsty. If you're still hungry, he recommends a healthy and delicious banana. For everything else, he thinks he can help you out with some fun new voting games!

This pack contains three voting simulations (a fancy word that means “experience”):

Simple Majority Voting, Electoral College Voting, and Ranked Choice Voting. The voting games use the same code, but each has different rules. **For each game, students are voting for their next school principal, and must choose their candidates wisely!** Let's rock the vote!

VOTING VOCAB

Vote: to make an official choice for or against someone or something by casting a ballot, raising your hand, speaking your choice aloud, etc.

Ballot: a ticket or piece of paper used to vote in an election

Election: the act or process of choosing someone for a public office by voting

Candidate: a person who is trying to be elected

Electoral college (USA): a group of people chosen from each U.S. state who meet to elect the President and Vice President of the U.S. based on the votes of all the people in each state

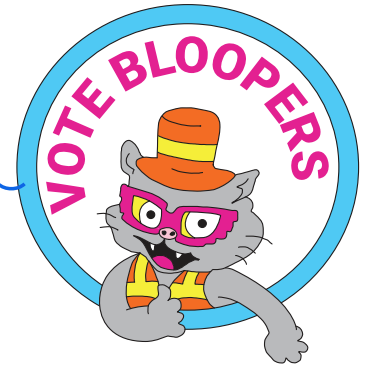
VOTE SPLATS

MEET THE CANDIDATES



CRASH "I think we should all live in tree houses. I believe in spontaneous dance parties, really loud music, and making pink the official color of Earth. If you vote for me, I promise every child in the world all-you-can-eat bugs!"

BLOOPERS "I like making mistakes. I promise to make a lot of mistakes, but also to learn from them! Sometimes when I'm flying in my rocket ship, I think about how we don't take enough naps, and it makes me sad. I believe in naps."



CANDYCORN "Do you believe in magic? I do. One time I used my horn to open a can of grape soda. It was messy but very good. Also, I can fly! If you vote for me, I'll get us some sodas. Also, I think horses should be able to drive cars. We can talk about this more later."

ROWDY "I'm a dog. I'm everyone's best friend! I think we should all go outside more, maybe catch a ball in our mouths. I don't know what a computer is, but it sounds really cool. If you vote for me, I promise not to bite."

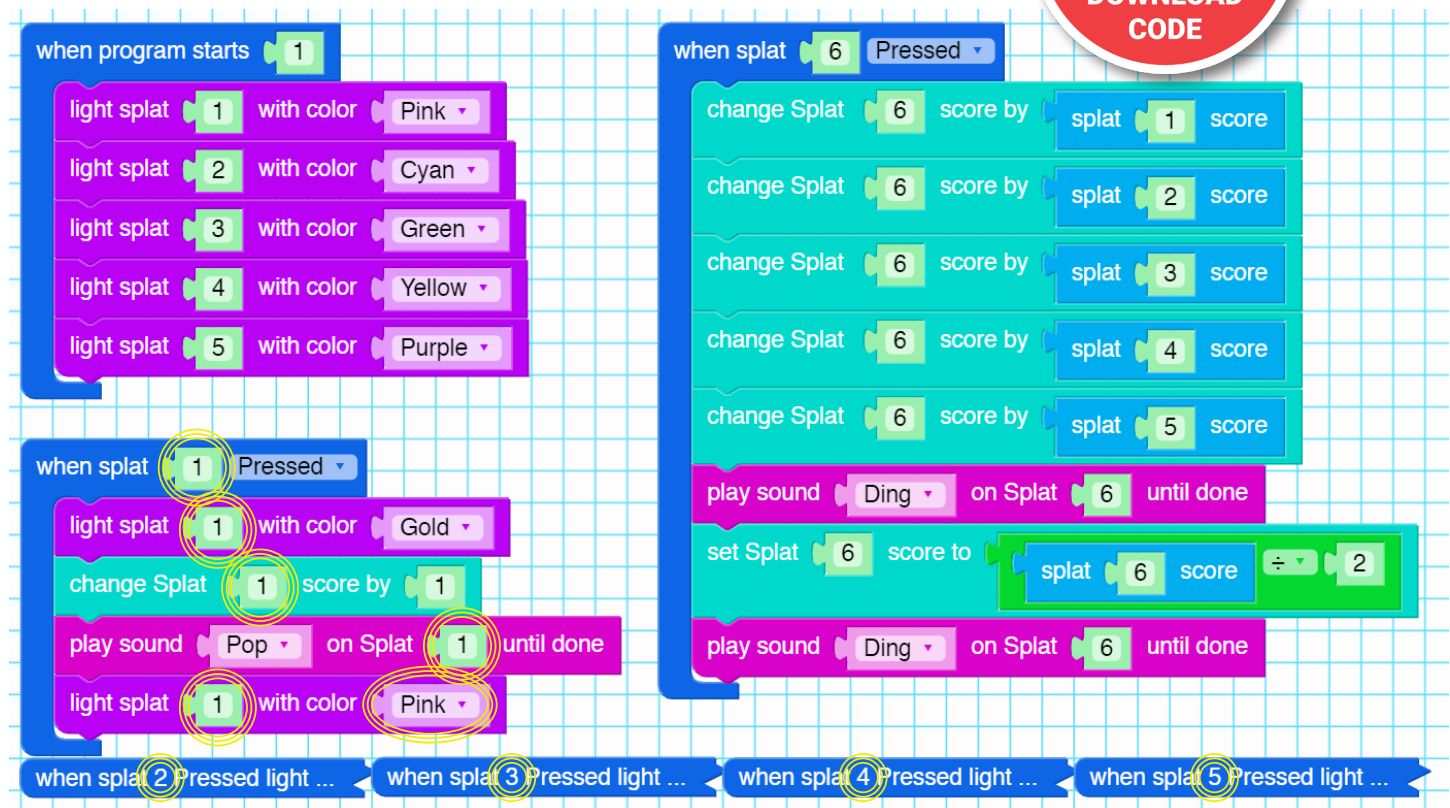
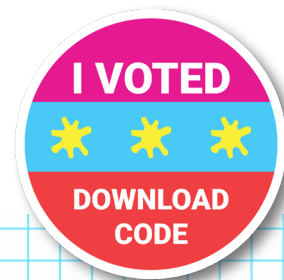

CODE BUILDING | HOW IT WORKS

To start, grab a **when program starts** block, and **light Splats 1-5** their candidate colors: pink, cyan, green, yellow, and purple. All three Votes Splats activities can use the same exact code!

Next, grab a **when splat pressed** block, and set it up with the four blocks shown. These blocks have the effect of switching the Splat to gold to show it is pressed, increasing that Splat's score by one to show it was voted for, playing a POP sound to show the vote was registered, and returning the Splat to its original color.

Once you have those five blocks set up, right click, or long press the **when splat pressed** stack, and duplicate it! Once you have it duplicated, **change all** of the **splat numbers** and **color blocks** to match the next Splat in line, 2, 3, 4, or 5. In our image here, **when splat pressed** blocks 2-5 are collapsed to simplify the code image – they are exactly the same as **when splat pressed 1**!

Our **when splat 6 pressed** block is used in *Ranked Choice Voting* to add up all of the votes, display the total number, and divide that by two to show what number would win the election.

To build: change **Splat 6's score** by each of the other Splats' score to add them all up, and **play a sound** to show they have been added. To divide that total by two, use a **math block** inside the **set splat 6 score** block. That looks like: **set splat 6 score to, splat 6 score divided by two**. To show the number has been updated, play another sound!

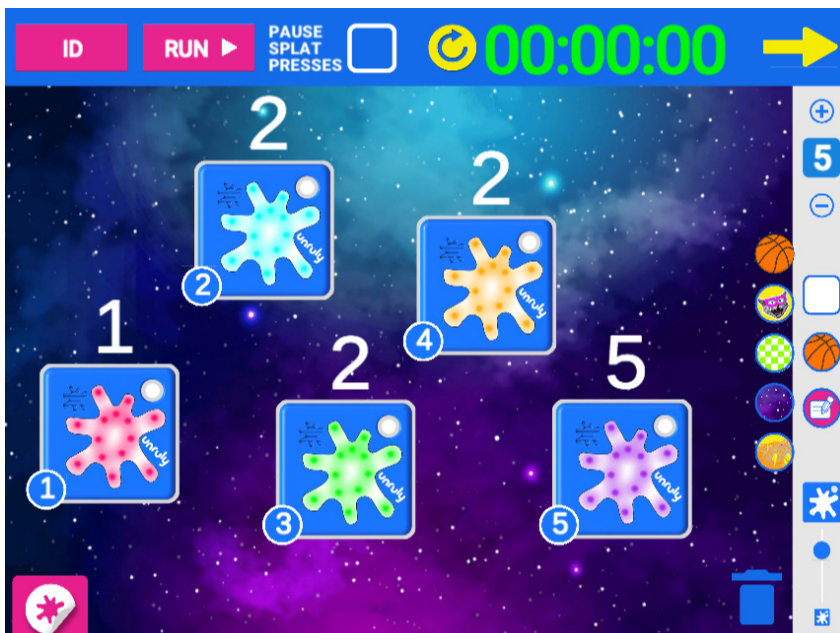

GAME RULES: VOTE FOR YOUR FAVORITE CANDIDATE. IF THERE IS A TIE FOR MOST VOTES, EVERYONE VOTES AGAIN BUT ONLY CHOOSING BETWEEN THE TIED CANDIDATES.

GAME SUMMARY

Voters form five or more groups, or 'states,' each lead by an Elector who will cast the final vote for the group. One at a time, each group performs a simple vote, to pick a winner.

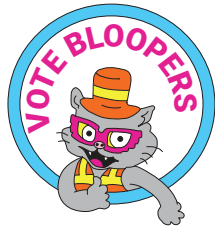
After every group has decided how their Elector will vote, one more simple vote is performed by all of the Electors. Whichever candidate gets the most Elector votes, WINS! *If there is a tie for winner in the Electoral vote, perform one last simple vote with the whole class to pick a winner between those candidates.*

GAME RULES: DECIDE AS GROUPS HOW YOUR ELECTOR WILL VOTE IN THE FINAL ELECTION. ELECTORS ALL VOTE FOR THEIR GROUP'S CHOICE IN A SIMPLE VOTE, AND THE MOST VOTES WINS! — *IN CASE OF AN ELECTORAL TIE, PERFORM A SIMPLE VOTE TO BREAK THE TIE —*

STOP AND THINK

- How does this system of voting, instead of simple voting, change the result of the race?
- Does swapping around who is in what groups change the result of the vote?
- Do groups of different sizes change the outcome of the vote?

In this form of voting, everyone writes their choices in order from first to fifth choice. Just like *simple voting*, everyone votes for their **top** choice candidate. Once all of the votes have been cast, Splat 6 is pressed. Splat 6 will add up all of the votes, and divide that total by two.

If any candidate gets at least 50% (total votes / 2) of the votes cast, they win! If no candidate gets that many votes, the candidate(s) with the lowest (or tied for lowest) number of votes is eliminated and ~~crossed off~~ everyone's list.

Voting begins again, and everyone votes for their top candidate that isn't crossed off. This will be the same candidate for most voters! After all votes are cast in the second round, Splat 6 is pressed and the votes compared. This vote and eliminate process continues until one candidate gets at least 50% of the vote, as calculated by pressing Splat 6!

GAME RULES: WRITE YOUR CHOICES IN ORDER FROM ONE TO FIVE. EVERYONE VOTES FOR THEIR TOP CHOICE, AND SPLAT 6 IS PRESSED. IF ANY CANDIDATE GOT AT LEAST THE NUMBER OF VOTES THAT SPLAT 6 CALCULATES, THEY WIN! IF NOT, THE LOWEST, OR TIED FOR LOWEST, CANDIDATES ARE ELIMINATED AND CROSSED OFF LISTS. VOTE AGAIN FOR YOUR HIGHEST, NON-CROSSED-OFF CHOICE — REPEATING UNTIL ONE CANDIDATE WINS!
